FELINE DECLAWS

Clay litter is NOT to be used after the declaw, as the particles can get in between the toes and cause an infection. You may use shredded newspaper or “Yesterday’s News” cat litter that is available from the clinic to avoid any risk of infection.

Please check the feet daily for swelling, discharge, or difficulty walking.

For a period of one to two weeks after surgery, it is considered normal for your pet to move more slowly than usual. Chewing or excessive licking of the feet is NOT normal. If this occurs, please call the clinic and we will set up an appointment to examine your pet.

For the first 2-3 days, keep your pet from jumping, especially from the furniture to the floor. This will help prevent discomfort and bleeding from the feet.

Notify the veterinarian if any of the following occur:

- Your cat is chewing or excessive licking their feet
- Your cat refuses to eat or seems depressed after the first day home
- The feet are swollen, or have discharge or having difficulty walking after the first few days at home
- There is a change in your cat’s overall general health.
